Following the Public Services Department's consultation on the future of sewage and wastewater treatment in Guernsey, Long Port has presented proposals to the Department of a suggested public private partnership to provide and deliver a sustainable, integrated Waste Management Facility, to help to resolve this problem which our island is facing. Long Port is working with WS Atkins on the proposals for a state of the art combined waste water treatment works and municipal solid waste disposal to energy plant at Longue Hogue. Longue Hogue has been identified by The States as the most appropriate site in the island.

Long Port have also presented a number of ideas and options to the States of Guernsey which would create substantial and sustainable economic growth for the Island through the regeneration of the eastern seaboard waterfront and the enhancing and maximising the value of our Island's assets and help fund the wastewater ...

Our proposals included the enhancement of the coastline from St Peter Port Harbour to St Sampson's Harbour. Our proposals were well received by the Public Service Department and we have now been invited to present our vision to all of the States members.
